En route we stopped at Mrs Heller's grave. Emma Heller died in 1885; as there was too much snow to get her body to Mansfield a coffin was brought to Toombullup instead and she was buried there. Her grave is off Madhouse Rd not far from the Tatong/Tolmie Rd.


At Stringybark Creek, the new signs were found to be informative, attractive and give a good overview; covering both the Kelly history and that of the police-

men who were murdered.

There is now a pleasant 1.4km walking trail through the bush which passes where Sqt Kennedy's body was found.

We drove round to the camping ground, to enjoy lunch at a picnic table in the shade, then set off for home via the Old Tolmie and Tiger Hill roads; an interesting trip so long as one has a good navigator on board (thank you Geoff, and Terry, never needed to check the GPS!)


The Stringybark Creek site is around 27km from Tatong, and makes for a pleasant outing.





THE LIGHTS OF BUDAPEST

Each evening on our Rhine / Danube cruise, just before dinner, our cruise director gave a briefing on the next day's events. She would go over the tour options for the next day and times to meet for departure. She would give us a heads up on special things to look out for and sometimes local foods we might try.

On the second last night her advice was quite simple – have an early breakfast and be on deck before nine for our approach into Budapest. As always, it was good advice – it was so picturesque.

Budapest has eight bridges linking Buda and Pest, the towns on each side of the river. Budapest became one city in 1873 with the amalgamation of right bank Buda and left bank Pest. Pest is very flat and Buda sits on seven hills. Because of this, Pest was prone to flood and sustain severe building damage. Therefore much of Pest only dates to the 19th century. Buda is much older because of this. It's also the Toorak / South Yarra of Budapest.

Pest has a huge square called 'Heroes Square'. This is where, in 1989, a young man urged a large crowd to throw out the communists. The square was surrounded by Russian tanks and it wasn't long after Tiananmen Square. The world press were there and the Russians did nothing. That young man became Prime Minister.

Another place I can highly recommend to visit.



Sunday, 9th September: England

Easyjet to Stansted in Essex, 25 minutes, flying in over the Zuyder Zee and looking up the German coast. Goodbye.

At the airport we bought Time Magazine with an article on Angela Merkel. Hajo admires her but disapproves. Anna who takes little notice of politics dislikes her. Our generation call her Muttie (mother). She is accused of taking too long to make decisions but it turns out she does her own research and reading, rather than just listening to her advisors. When she has done that she draws those around her into joint resolutions, a characteristic of the German style of democracy and voting system. In the meantime we have a new government in Australia and we begin to find that the people we know, who all have some connection with Australia, are puzzled or just laugh at Tony Abbott's 'turn back the illegal immigrants' and 'cancel the carbon tax'. I look back at my country and have this feeling or realization of our insularity. It is an uncomfortable feeling.

And I have been surprised by the outgoing and expressive Germans, the interest as soon as they hear you are Australian, the willingness to help, the politeness. Whilst they have as dense a population as anywhere in Europe requiring tiny roads and cars, on the flat Niedersaxon plain, the skies are huge so you do not feel it.

Little things driven by climate or convenience make Germany and Holland seem technically advanced to Australia. (This went on in the UK). The train doors keep closing we think the trains are about to leave. But it is to keep out the cold. On the outside you press a button on the side of the carriage door and it opens again. Zips on jackets have a double tag at the bottom of the zip. One to do the jacket up, and another to pull up to open the jacket at the bottom so you can get on your bike.

I still can't believe we're leaving. What fun we've had!



Why is it important to pump my septic tank out regularly?

Over time scum and sludge layers build up in your septic tank, eventually limiting the amount of available liquid. This does not allow the septic tank to perform one of its basic functions - to allow for settling of solids below the outlet level. The waste will then flow directly on to the next part of the system untreated. If this situation persists, the scum and sludge will flow through to the distribution field, eventually causing blockages and malfunction - a messy, smelly and costly exercise to repair.

It is recommended that septic tanks are pumped out every 3 - 5 years

ART WORK AND THE RICH HISTORY OF TATONG AND DISTRICT

Thanks to our Heritage Group enthusiasts and people like Greg Kirk we have lots of historic documents and photos of our district.

Now we have the Pedro Schroder and Mike Larkin version of the *Kelly gang prospecting in the Tatong Hills* on display on a small "silo" (tank) at the Tavern carpark. Pedro would like to hold an opening event when he has all the "ducks lined up."

The mural comprises 5 separate scenes four of which are from historic photos and the central feature depicts Ned and the boys at a small creek in the surrounding hills. My painting belongs in the regions where art and facts are blurred because apparently the gang did some prospecting, so I just needed to create a "vision" of that activity. A painting which is not based upon the actual scene or a photo is a tricky exercise which may work, or not, and I am pleased to say that for me it worked well enough. The scene does not depict any of the conflict and bloodshed that the gang experienced even though one character holds a rifle, a small symbol of their outlaw lives. I enjoyed trying to capture the beauty and peace of our bushland in the surrounding hills and especially creating a small creek with plenty of actual water in it. I have not included a photo because it's not officially 'opened' yet and it's a good reason to stop at the Tavern to have a look at the real thing.

Footnote for New Zealand. Speaking of guns and gangs and New Zealand has just experienced its first terrible terrorism atrocity when 50 Muslim people were shot dead in mosques in Christchurch. Ironic for a city named after the Christian figurehead and a reminder that not much has changed since Christianity began just over 2000 years ago. 
