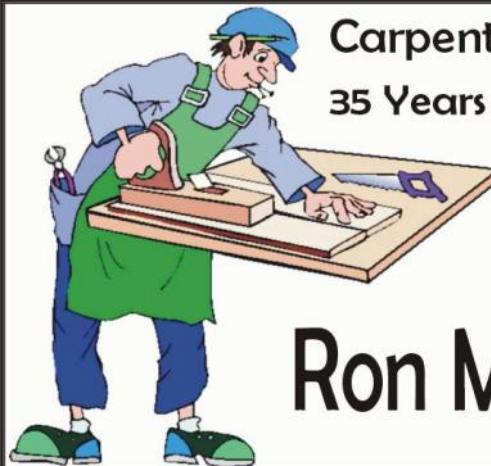

Gawn to Town

The bunnies are back. Hopping about with those little white tails that ought be cute; except they're on rabbits. I trapped rabbits once, in another life. Yes, with those horrible now-illegal steel-jawed traps. I learnt to skin them, but I wasn't interested in using the skins. Found I didn't much care for the meat any way I could work out to cook it (cooking was an art I was yet to learn). Then I began getting hay-fever when skinning rabbits. Gave up trapping rabbits.

It wasn't as though I was hungry, or struggling for a quid, like those who: *"-skinned and scalped and scalped and skinned, till my back was nearly broke,"* and *"- slaved all day for half a crown for the Sydney market bloke."*

"The Rabbits Song" by Stan Wakefield recalls the 1930s, when the govt encouraged young men to earn a living this way rather than apply for the dole. No doubt the govt made rabbiting sound like the Army ads of today; a sporting, roving life. Travel to new lands, pit your wits against the rabbits, get ripped off by market forces.

"I thought I'd get a sniffer cheque for skins I sent from Bourke, But the broker rogues in Sydney Town, they weigh them short and they grade them down, And they sent me back three lousy pound, for a month of slavin' work." It is a raucous, cheery song, and probably much more fun to listen to than to experience.

The rabbits numbers were building up hereabouts barely a year ago. Bunnies were burrowing under my plants, and managed to kill two nicely established shrubs. I cursed them soundly, which I might regret if I'm every reincarnated as a rabbit. And they can point out that it wasn't their idea to come to this land.

Then one of the viruses arrived, and went through the rabbits like... Covid19. Which at least enabled Gertie the Labrador to catch her first bunny. The rabbit wasn't so much running as staggering, but Gertie was pretty pleased with herself. She was still trying to work out how to unwrap it, when I offered her a dog biscuit in exchange, and her bunny supper vanished.

"Rabbits boiled, rabbits fried," - There was a grace; a recital of all the ways one might prepare a rabbit, and no doubt the writer had tried every one. It finishes

Perhaps the Anti-Meat movement, while preferring a concoction of ground red kidney beans made to look like a bunny leg (would it bring good luck?) might accept 'wild-caught' rabbit.

Then we could go back to eating boiled rabbit for breakfast. I believe I have a recipe.

TATONG FIRE SHED MURAL UPDATE

The most asked question I get is: "Is it finished yet." I am now at the 99.999999 % finished, but even that is just a guess and I say that because the overall scene will appear to be complete to most eyes other than mine.

This leads to the next step which is when will it officially be declared finished and where and when is the opening event? We had thought that it may be in March but there were some devils in the detail so we must wait for other related matters to be completed. For instance it will be a suitable occasion for brigade awards as well as an information plaque (not plague) for the mural and the renewal of the fencing beside the shed wall. This all means that the opening will not occur in March but we will notify via the Tattler when all is ready and a date set.

For anyone interested in getting a photo of the whole wall it would pay to have a zoom lens and photograph it from beside the Benalla road. Otherwise you can sneak into Pete Smith's paddock, remembering to shut the gate, and frame it to suit your camera. The best time of day is the morning at around 10am at the moment because various shadows happen, one at the east end early and at the west end later in the morning. The ripples in the shed cladding are in direct sun around 10am so that there is no dark shadow down the side of every ripple. The shadows all change as the seasonal arc of the sun change so you just have to keep watching it. In the afternoon when the sun is behind the fire shed wall it is not conducive to a good photo without a zoom or camera which can cope with the stark contrast between the bright sky and the dark wall.

SEPTIC PUMP OUTS

Why is it important to pump my septic tank out regularly?

Over time scum and sludge layers build up in your septic tank, eventually limiting the amount of available liquid. This does not allow the septic tank to perform one of its basic functions - to allow for settling of solids below the outlet level.

The waste will then flow directly on to the next part of the system untreated. If this situation persists, the scum and sludge will flow through to the distribution field, eventually causing blockages and malfunction - a messy, smelly and costly exercise to repair.

It is recommended that septic tanks are pumped out every 3 - 5 years

Garden Daze

The best time to plant a tree is 20 years ago - the next best time is now



Heading into Autumn after a cooler Summer than usual.

Although the tomatoes, eggplant and capsicum are still producing - it is getting to be time to start thinking about preparing for autumn planting.



Weeding is a great start to getting ready.

Cut down the competition between vegetables and unwanted invaders and have a good old tidy up and reap the benefits of your efforts.

Mulching and Planning Ahead

Preparing beds now means the garden will be ready and waiting for the Autumn planting.

Top up the mulch on vegetable beds, herb gardens and ornamental beds. Mulch after watering, to a depth of about 7cm. Keep mulch clear of plant stems, especially young seedlings. Choose a mulch that will enrich the soil as it breaks down - a rake, some good organic compost and a sustainable mulch is the perfect recipe for a productive garden.



Watering

At this time of the year water first thing in the morning. A good soaking a couple of times a week is far more beneficial than frequent, short watering.

Green Manure for Soil Improvement

If you have vacant beds - get ready for the next crop with some green manure. Try sowing cow pea, mung bean, soy bean or millet. When about 30 cm high smash down and dig in the greenery. This will improve the soil, and be well worth the effort.



Plants benefit from seaweed tea or low environmental impact liquid fertiliser at this time of the year, especially for any late plantings. Apply to the soil early in the morning, and in the concentrations mentioned on the packet.



Crops to plant - there are a number of plants that can be planted as the weather becomes cooler in March:

Try:

PLANT: Garlic cloves - when the weather cools a bit.

Seedlings of: celery, kale, cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli, winter lettuce, silverbeet, spring and salad onion, chives and leeks.

SOW: Beetroot, carrot and parsnip early in March only.

Then turnip, English spinach, broad beans, Asian leaf and root vegetables, spring and salad onions, lettuce and into vacant beds, green manure crops.

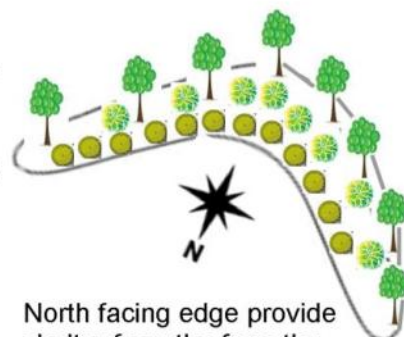
To add some colour and movement: Plant stock, dianthus, viola, pansy, verbena and ageratum.



Now is a good time to start thinking about getting some more trees into the ground.

We have planted a couple of "boomerangs" in the middle of the paddocks over the years and plan another for this year.

A "boomerang" (my word for it) is a plantation which provides shade in the summer from the tall Eucalypts on the far side while in the winter, the shorter thicker shrubs in the centre and



North facing edge provide shelter from the cold wind.

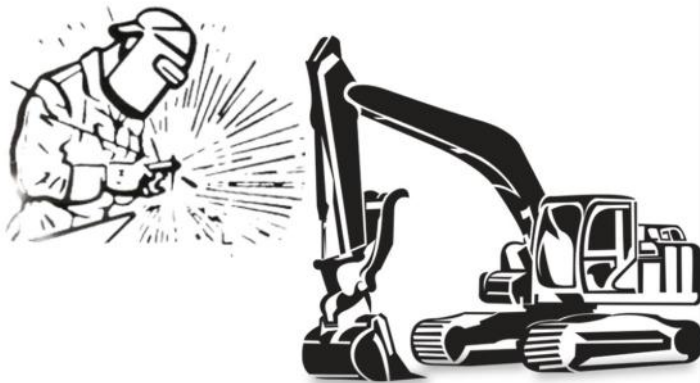

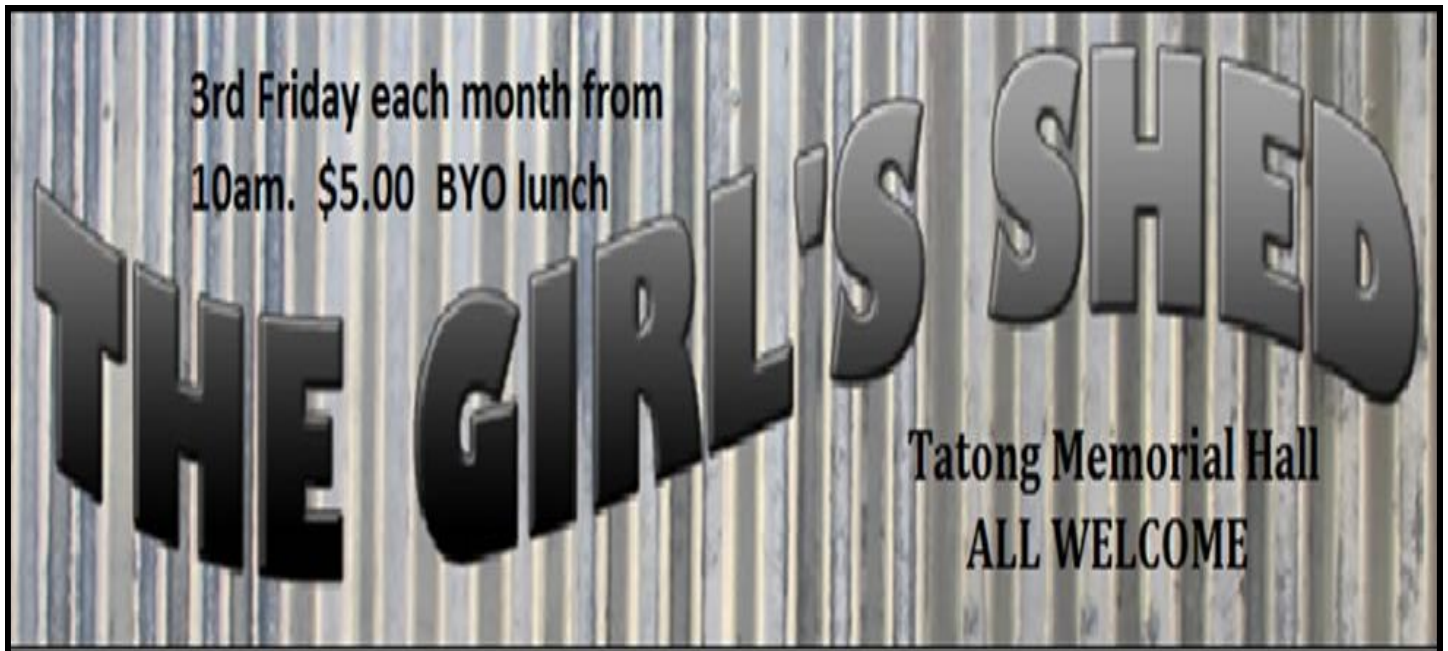

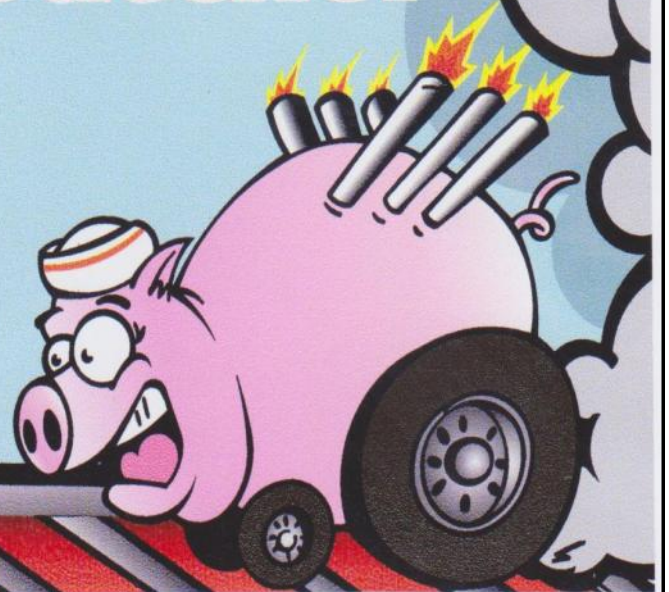

It has a strange sticky-out bit on one side.

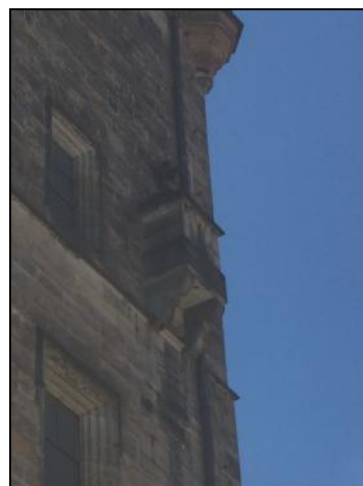
Any thoughts on what it might be?

The library beside the Tavern is sporting a new cabinet to hold the books and it is most impressive.

This upgrade was completed by Terry and Sue O'Brien from Tolmie Rd, beside the telephone exchange. Sue said the upgrade was needed due to the library's popularity. This is a great community gesture which is much appreciated.

I have not been a big reader in my dotage because I probably used up all my reading enthusiasm when young. As we lived 3 miles out of Yallourn I would, for instance, get 5 Westerns at a time, read them in a week and get another 5 for the next week. One day I just got tired of them and went onto biography and other non-fiction. I did really like the author Neville Shute and there is a book of his in this Tatong library.

AND AN ADDENDUM

I still occasionally read books and biography is still the favourite. I just completed the bio of Aussie Dr Claire Weekes, borrowed from the Benalla Library. She was the originator of revolutionary treatments for what she called "Nervous Illness." Her book "Self Help for Your Nerves" is a classic and I for one had my life changed because of it. In this era of awareness raising about mental illness I have no hesitation in promoting this small miracle of a book to anyone who suffers from such things as panic attacks, agoraphobia or any similar fear based problems. Such nervous problems can be excruciating and are made so much worse by feelings of embarrassment, helplessness and shame. The truly brilliant aspect of this small book is that it is SELF HELP and that means that it is within your own power to heal yourself as, probably by now, millions of people have done, and worldwide. (This is to say that such self-help can be successful for the less severe forms of mental ill health.)

I know for certain that it is possible to understand, learn and gradually become liberated from what is fundamentally the 'fear of fear'. Weekes herself needed great inner conviction in order to be heard amongst the tide of prevailing psychiatric conventions and in the long run her work has prevailed and is deeply appreciated by the vast numbers of recovered sufferers. She persevered in part because she herself suffered two years of nervous illness, from which she recovered due in part to timely help, study and determination.

I would like to encourage anyone interested in nervous illness by repeating the outlook Weekes had about the nervous sufferer. She found that it is 'the good ones' who mostly suffer because of characteristics such as their sensitivity, conscientiousness and honesty etc. While a common perception of nervous suffering indicates failure and weakness many such people go on to great success and happiness in part because of the depth of courage and perseverance they have needed in overcoming their 'demons.'

NOTE: I am not a professional and this is not medical advice. It is plain-speak from one mental health sufferer to any others. I am not intending to diminish the work of any medical professionals because before I knew about Weeke's book I was greatly assisted by a psychiatrist after experiencing a severe and terrifying panic attack.
